### LIONS N.S.W. - A.C.T. SAVE SIGHT FOUNDATION TO EACH LIONS MEMBER

#### History

*During the course of the 22<sup>nd</sup> Multiple District Convention at Canberra in May 1974, the Lions of New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory met and at their meeting adopted and created Lions N.S.W. - A.C.T. Save Sight Foundation Ltd..*

*On 29<sup>th</sup> November, 1974 the Foundation was incorporated as a Public Company Limited by Guarantee under the New South Wales Companies Act.*

*The Foundation was officially launched at a luncheon at the Wentworth Hotel, Sydney on the 8<sup>th</sup> April, 1975 on which occasion the State Government for New South Wales most generously donated the sum of \$10,000 to the Foundation's funds.*

*The Australian Taxation Office has confirmed that Gifts of \$2.00 and upwards to the "LIONS N.S.W. - A.C.T. SAVE SIGHT FOUNDATION CHARITABLE TRUST" are allowable as deductions by the donors under the special provisions of section 78 (a) (a) of the Income Tax Assessment Act. The reference of such confirmation and for such Income Tax Deductions is Reference No. 1595C SF4940*

*The Chief Secretary's Department for New South Wales has registered "LIONS N.S.W. - A.C.T. SAVE SIGHT FOUNDATION LTD." As a charitable organization pursuant to the provisions of the Charitable Collections Act (Reference No. C.C.22512).*

*In the 3 years since 8<sup>th</sup> April, 1975, \$770,000.00 has been raised towards the Foundation's aim to raise at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) which money is invested and the income from such investments is used to achieve the Foundation's Objects.*

*The Foundation's aim to raise at least One million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) in the 3 years concluding on the 8<sup>th</sup> April, 1978 should be achieved providing the Foundation continues to receive the wonderful support which it has in the last 3 years in the following ways:*

1. *The six (6) districts within N.S.W. and the A.C.T. contributing the profit to Districts from the sale of Christmas Cakes to the Foundation.*
2. *The Clubs within N.S.W. and the A.C.T. contributing the profit to Clubs from the sale of Christmas Cakes to the Foundation.*
3. *Clubs participating in the 1978 Lions N.S.W.-A.C.T. Miss Personality Quest.*
4. *Clubs participating in the 1978 Ringathon Project.*
5. *Clubs becoming 100% "Participating Clubs" for 1977/8.*
6. *Individual Lions becoming members of the Foundation for 1977/8 by making an individual donation of at least \$10.00 to the Foundation.*

# LIONS KEEP AN EYE ON BABY HEALTH

(Article printed in 'Daily Examiner' Saturday August 8, 2009)



## "LOOKING TO THE FUTURE:

Clarence Valley Lions Clubs joined forces to raise funds for an Indirect Ophthalmoscope for Grafton Base Hospital. The instrument will be used to check the eyesight of premature babies, alleviating the need for parents to take their babies to Coffs Harbour for testing.

Project organiser Deyann McDonnell said the instrument cost about \$5,000, with half raised from community fundraising and the balance donated by the Lions Clubs NSW-ACT Save Sight Foundation.

In its letter of appreciation, the North Coast Area Health Service expressed "great pleasure and gratitude for the HEINE UNPLUGGED BINOCULAR OPHTHALMOSCOPE, VIEW 20D AND 30D LENSES AND ACCESSORIES which is now in use in the Maternity Unit at the Grafton Base Hospital". The letter went on to acknowledge the support of the foundation and the lions clubs of Maclean, Yamba, Wooli, Grafton and Big River,

The neo-natal ophthalmoscope will be beneficial for the premature babies at Grafton base hospital. It reduces the need to transport premature babies out of hospital to have their eyes tested and will also allow premature babies born elsewhere to be returned to Grafton sooner as they can now have their eyes tested there.

## GRANT APPLICATION FORM

As of the March 2009 Board meeting, the maximum 'ordinary' grant that may be applied for has been limited to \$15,000.00 and the minimum contribution that is expected to be found by an applicant is 50% of the cost of the project. The global economic downturn has seen a significant decrease in investment income available to fund grants and the changes have been introduced so that as many clubs as possible may be assisted.

called Little Paxton in St Neots, just outside Cambridge in UK. It was different to visiting England because we were actually "living" England. We were involved with the local community, Church, Folk Group, Lions, Pub, Markets, Auctions and of course, Car Boot Sales.

I think, well that is I hope, as an ambassador for Australian Lions, I presented myself well. I visited a number of Clubs and going by the after-meeting meetings it appeared that my explanation of what Lions are doing in Australia was well accepted.

At this point, and with good reason, I would like to sincerely congratulate the Lions of NSW for their ownership two of the greatest Foundations in the Lions organisation. I refer to the Save Sight and Public Health Care Foundations. From what I could derive, our Foundations are unique, really special. At various UK Clubs, I spoke with pride on the benefit our communities gain because of the foresight the Lions of NSW had when establishing the Lions NSW-ACT Save Sight Foundation and then later following up with the Lions NSW-ACT Public Health Care Foundation. I transferred this pride to them, stating that as Lions, they were part of this community giving and because they chose to become a Lion, they also shared in joy of improving the quality of life for someone even if that someone is as far away as Australia. But in saying all of this, believe me, I could find nothing to compare with either of these Foundations.

As many of you know, upon my retirement as Chairman, rightly or wrongly, the Foundations honoured me with the presentation of prestigious honour awards. Whether the awards were justified or not is now irrelevant but nevertheless whenever I ventured outside of our flat in England, the first job was to attach my pins to my collar, not attached as a status symbol but rather as a sign of dedication or commitment. A profound statement that "I am a Lion" and bloody proud of it. Although the pins generally passed un-noticed, they were detected when least expected and might I say, they were picked up more by Rotarians than Lions. Must have been the localities I was in I guess.

A lot of you would have read the epistles of my journeys through the battlefields of Northern France, (the Somme) and Ypres in Belgium, (Flanders Fields). I hope I did not distress anybody with my emotional explanations of my travels. I would the day that every Australian could experience the poignant feelings as I did during my visits to these special parts of "Australia in a foreign land".

So much for the emotion; I still hold a special place in my heart for the Foundations and am always searching for news of their activities. Please, accept my appeal to all of you to contribute something to the Perspective Newsletter. This in itself, if produced regularly with stories of achievements, grant presentations and items of interest, (even the occasional joke), This communication is by far the most far reaching and the best promotional tool you have. It is the greatest opportunity to make the Lions of NSW aware of the wonderful benefit they have within their reach and within their own Foundations. Remember, "We need them to help us so that we can help them so that they can help others"
