New ultrasound machine a gift.

A New ultrasound machine at Gosford Hospital's renal unit will be welcomed by both doctors and patients and it's all thanks to Lions and club members. Funding for the machine was provided by the Australian Lions foundation, Lions NSW/ACT Public Health Care Foundation and seven Central Coast Lions Clubs. Representatives from both foundations along with members of the Wyong Lions Club, who instigated the project, visited the hospital last week to check out the machine for themselves. "This machine provides increased safety for the patient," Gosford Hospital's renal unit nurse manager Jo Kemp said. It can be used to ascertain if there is a increased build-up of fluid in the abdomen of dialysis patients resulting in timely treatment. The ultrasound machine has also been used by surgeons while operating to determine blood flow through the fistula. Because it is mobile the machine can be easily moved to assist renal patients in other areas of the hospital, outside the renal unit, Mrs Kemp said.

Foundation. He thanked the local community, and Port


Macquarie Lions Club, for their continued support. Mr Elford also had a special thanks to local

What is a corneal transplant?



The cornea is the clear tissue that covers the lens at the front of the eye. Blindness caused by clouding or distortion of the eye can be repaired by removing the damaged cornea and transplanting a healthy cornea from a donor. During the transplant, the defective cornea is replaced by an identical sized piece of healthy corneal tissue and is held in place with sutures that are painless and nearly invisible. The operation was first performed over a hundred years ago in 1905 and is still the basis for the current surgical technique. **"...the most common and successful human**
