GRANTS APPROVED AT THE 28 MARCH 2010 BOARD MEETING

(N2) - up to **\$1,515.00** for the purchase, set-up and fitting of a **Custom Glide Lightweight Wheelchair** for a 26 year old male with intellectual disability, severe epilepsy, autism and several other health issues. The total GST exclusive cost of the project is \$6.830.00 with \$1,515.00 contributed by the applicant and a further \$3,800.00 from the ACT Equipment Subsidy Scheme. The Grantee is Gungahlin Regional Community Service Inc. (ABN: 54 882 747 318).

No. 562: Lions Club of Oak Flats Inc (N2) - up to **\$1,264.00** for the purchase of a **Low Level Laser** for Shellharbour Hospital. The total GST exclusive cost of the project is \$2,863.64 with \$1,599.64 contributed by the applicant. The Grantee is South Eastern Sydney and Illawarra Area Health Service Inc. (ABN: 78 390 886 131).

No. 563: Lions Club of West Pennant Hills-Cherrybrook Inc. (N5) - up to **\$5,846.35** for the purchase of a **Kinematics Polytron 2100 System** for The Children's Hospital at Westmead. The total GST exclusive cost of the project is \$13,346.35 with \$7,500.00 contributed by the applicant. The Grantee is The Royal Alexandra Hospital for Children (ABN: 53 188 579 090).

No. 564: Lions Club of East Maitland Inc. (N3) - up to **\$2,000.00** for the purchase of a **Pentax Fibre Optic Video Laryngoscope** for Maitland Hospital Operating Theatres Anaesthetic Department. The total GST exclusive cost of the project is \$8,000.00 with \$4,000.00 contributed by the applicant. The Grantee is Hunter New England Area Health Service. (ABN: 24 500 842 605).

No. 565: Lions Club of East Gosford Inc. (N3) - up to **\$2,942.00** for the **Conversion of Kia Carnival vehicle to Transport a Child in a Wheelchair, Set up and fitting of a wheelchair ramp** for a six year old male child who suffers from cerebral palsy, epilepsy and a degenerative metabolic disease. The total GST exclusive cost of the project is \$28,942.00 with \$2,000.00 contributed by the applicant and three other clubs in Zone 1 and \$24,000.00 from other contributions. LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION - SYDNEY 2010

The Foundations, in conjunction with the Lions NSW Eye Bank and the Save Sight Institute were promoted worldwide at the recent Lions Clubs International Convention in Sydney.

Conventioneers and visitors were attracted to the 3m x 3m corner display space by recently acquired attention grabbing pull-up display banners. Upon entering the display space visitors viewed a short "Lions NSW Eye Bank" video, peruse the numerous colourful, interesting and informative posters and take away various booklets and brochures.



On hand to discuss the work of the foundations and the eye bank and to answer questions were foundations directors and transplant coordinators from the Lions NSW Eye Bank.

The display was well

received and the subject of a great deal of interest from both local and overseas visitors.

Also, director of the Lions Save Sight Institute, Professor Peter McClusky, was invited to address the

international forum on sight health and the Save Sight Institute.

As a flow on from our participation in the Lions International Convention, your foundation now has complete promotional kits to allow the easy set up of displays at district conventions, shopping centres, shows and the like.

We have two full kits composed of a laptop computer with speakers and a 32" display monitor all packed in a particle board travel case for easy transport. In addition, the kits will include two pull-up display banners, wall posters, sample award plaques and a plentiful supply of brochures and other promotional material.

ONCOLOGY RESEARCH UNIT at the CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL AT WESTMEAD TUMOUR BANK POLYTRON

It is through research that we gain the knowledge about cancer that will eventually lead to new approaches in therapy.

By providing samples to research groups throughout the world scientists will learn to understand the molecular mechanisms which lead to cancers in children and to develop improved clinical interventions for these patients.

The Tumour Bank at the Oncology Research Unit has a collection of cancer specimens, blood and bone marrow, donated by patients and obtained through the normal course of treatment. These samples are placed in frozen storage (-80°C) and made available to research scientists around the world for research investigations.

Currently,



the Tumour Bank holds over 25,000 tissue specimens donated by over 2500 patients representing 50 different types of cancer.

As a part of the Tumour Banks activity, staff provide specialist tissue handling expertise for research applications.

This includes processing tissue samples so as to isolate genetic material called DNA or RNA as well as proteins or other molecules which may be studied in the laboratory. To achieve this, specialist equipment is required.

The Kinematics Polytron instruments are designed to provide the appropriate dispersing and mixing technology for these biomedical applications. The instruments provide regulated control of rotor speed, soft start options, rapid

and simple coupling of the cutting blades and probe for efficient cleaning and sterilization and a quiet but powerful rotor/stator motor.

The Polytron instruments are the world standard for these applications.

GRANT APPLICATION FORM

The maximum 'ordinary' grant that may be applied for has now been limited to \$15,000.00 and the minimum contribution that is expected to be found by an applicant is 50% of the cost of the project.
