#### **GRANT APPLICATION FORM**

The maximum 'ordinary' grant that may be applied for has now been limited to \$15,000.00 and the minimum contribution that is expected to be found by an applicant is 50% of the cost of the project. The global economic downturn has seen a significant decrease in investment income available to fund grants and the changes have been introduced so that as many clubs as possible may be assisted.

#### THE LIONS NSW EYE BANK

The Lions NSW Eye Bank can provide you with figures for the number of donors and transplants, how well we are preserving the tissue for transplantation and technological advances. However, this information is more about people and humanity. It is about people making a generous decision at a very difficult time to help give the most wondrous gift, the Gift of Sight.

The recent practice of corneal endothelial transplant surgery provides a glimpse into the future of corneal transplants. Since 1905 when the first successful corneal transplant was performed, the basic approach to corneal transplantation has largely remained unchanged; the full-thickness of the cornea is replaced with a full-thickness transplant.

More recently, for some patients, changes to this technique means that only the layer of the cornea that needs to be replaced has to be transplanted. Outcomes are much improved with faster recovery times and less need for re-transplantation at a later date. It is a huge milestone that we have reached that the 100 year anniversary of the first corneal transplant. It is still considered one of the most successful transplants performed, and one of the most common, with over 450 transplants done in New South Wales annually.

The Lions NSW Eye Bank is the centre for collection, storage, preparation and distribution of corneas in NSW and the ACT. It also provides eye material to a number of tertiary education institutions for valuable research into the causes of eye disease in the community.

If you or your family chose to be a donor then the question of whether the tissue can be used for other eye surgery or research into the causes of blindness is raised. Research will only be an option if your family has consented to it. Other parts of the eye including the sclera may still be used for transplantation, largely to rebuild the eye shape and is used in reconstruction surgery.

The Lions NSW Eye Bank enjoys a great working relationship with transplanting surgeons, the hospitals and coronial institutions that supply the donors and the community which we serve. ### **GOVERNMENT HOUSE RECEPTION FOR PROF. FRANK BILLSON**

On 16th October 2009 a Reception was held at Government House, in the presence of Her Excellency, Professor Marie Bashir AC, CVO Governor of New South Wales.

The occasion was to specifically thank all donors to the Save Sight Institute and was attended by three of our Foundation Directors, Jean-Claude Legrand, Max Holmes and Kerry Williams accompanied by their respective spouses.

As a tribute to the dedication and long service of Professor Frank Billson, Mrs Marno Parsons, a friend and donor to the institute commissioned Mr Mathew Lynn to paint a portrait of Professor Billson. During the evening Mrs Marno unveiled the portrait and presented Professor Billson with a replica drawing.

The portrait was donated to the institute and is to be hung in the Save Sight Clinic.

Pictured above Professor Billson proudly displays the portrait to all present and to his successor, Professor Peter McClusky MD, FRANZCO, FRACS - Director of the save Sight Institute and Professor of Ophthalmology at the University of Sydney.

Professor Frank Billson, Foundation Professor of Ophthalmology since 1978, had been Director of the Save Sight Institute, University of Sydney continuously since 1985 until his retirement in August 2008.

As foundation Director of the Save Sight Institute, he was responsible for the formation of fundraising for the commissioning of a laboratory and recruiting over 50 scientists and support staff for this facility. The Institute has attracted extensive research grants from the Lions NSW-ACT Save Sight Foundation and national and international

sources including government, industry, and support from the community. A new laboratory was commissioned in 1997 which is amongst the most modern and best equipped in Australia.

He was the Director of the Lions NSW Eye Bank and a member of the staff of the Sydney Eye Hospital and both children's hospitals in NSW. He is Hospitaller for Australia serving the Order of St John and the Jerusalem Eye Hospital and was instrumental in the establishment of outreach programs with St John Ambulance Australia, working with Aboriginal communities in Katherine NT and Dubbo NSW.

His enthusiasm and leadership are seen in his international commitments to the World Health Organisation and the International Agency for the Prevention of Blindness, where he was the first Chairman of the West Pacific Region and has worked in the Asia Pacific Region for more than 20 years. His work in Bangladesh led to the establishment of the Chair of Clinical Ophthalmology in the University of Chittagong, building an eye hospital and training complex and developing a program to train eye doctors and paramedics for eight base hospitals throughout Bangladesh. He has also helped develop ophthalmic training programs in Sri Lanka, India, China, Papua New Guinea, East Timor, Solomon Islands and Eye Banks in China and Vietnam.

In November 2003, he was awarded the International Blindness Prevention Award by the American Academy of Ophthalmology. He is an Officer of the Order of Australia and the first recipient of the Weary Dunlop Asia Medal "for selfless leadership in the service of both his profession and his country". He was made a Life Governor of the Lions NSW-ACT Save Sight Foundation and is an Honorary Lion.

#### **NEW CHAIRS MAKE DIALYSIS MORE COMFORTABLE**

Maitland Hospital's dialysis unit has celebrated its 10th anniversary with a \$38,000 boost.

The generosity of seven local Lions clubs means dialysis patients will now have access to seven new electric treatment chairs, providing treatment to 41 patients three times a week.

Nurse unit manager Patrice Dobbs said the specially designed chairs offered improved comfort and independence for patients.

"This is a very generous donation from Lions and we really appreciate their support for the unit and our patients. It's a great birthday present," Mrs Dobbs said.

"This has given us the opportunity to update the remainder of our treatment chairs all at once."

Zone 9 Lions chairwoman Rosalea Sellers said the donation

was a combined effort of the Lions Clubs of Branxton, East Maitland, Kurri Kurri, Maitland, and Rutherford and East Maitland/Beresfield and Rutherford Lioness Clubs.

The clubs were assisted by the Australian Lions Foundation and the Lions NSW-ACT Save Sight and Public Health Care Foundation.

# ELECTRIC BARIATRIC BEDS FOR BELLINGEN HOSPITAL

The warmth that comes from giving and helping the less fortunate in the community was felt by a group of Lions from the Lions club of Bellingen on Friday 11th December 2009.

Not only did they feel that warmth but the hospital treated them to a scrumptious afternoon tea, Why!

"We are very pleased that we have again been able to support the Maitland Hospital and have helped people in our local area who really need our assistance," Ms Sellers said.

The Maitland Dialysis Unit opened on December 3, 1999 and initially operated three days a week. It now operates 10 dialysis chairs with two treatment sessions a day, providing treatment to 20 patients a day, six days a week.

The members of the Lions Club of Bellingen got word that their local hospital was in need of some new electric beds and special mattresses. The beds and mattresses were going to cost almost \$11,000. The hospital had close to \$3,000 but needed some help with the balance.

Not afraid of a challenge the Lions Club mobilised their resources and set about raising the balance of the funds.

After raising an amount equivalent to the hospital's amount, the club applied to the Lions Clubs NSW-ACT Public Health

Care Foundation for a grant.

The grant, if approved, would enable the purchase of the three Low Height Electric Bariatric Hospital Beds, complete with accessories and three Bi-Density Mattresses for the Bellinger River District Hospital.

With the objectives of the Lions NSW-ACT Health Care Foundation being "To promote, advance and assist the research into the causes, diagnosis, prevention and treatment of illness, sickness and afflictions of all kinds suffered by humans.", the Foundation had no hesitation in approving the grant application and providing for almost \$5,500 to add to the funds raised by the Hospital and the Lions Club of Bellingen.

This is just another fine example of the community assistance made possible by the Foundation of the Lions Clubs of NSW and the ACT.
